

PERMANENT Makeup



Permanent liner permanent makeup technique is performed by placing pigment between epidermis and dermis with the use of a permanent makeup tattoo machine. It is a form of cosmetic tattooing. The permanentmakeup artist will use topical anesthetic to limit discomfort.

Durability: permanent liner is a tattoo. The tattoo, as all other tattoos, can fade depending on multiple factors (quality of pigment/ink used, UV exposure, use of in skincare products, medications). Tattooing is permanent, whether it is on the body or face. Immediately post treatment, liner will appear darker than expected, but will fade during the healing process over the following 4 weeks.

The treatment is typically a 2 step application process:

- The initial appointment includes consultation and initial application.
- The second appointment or so called touch up session a minimum of 4 weeks later is to refine the shape and fine-tune color.

Permanent makeup eyeliner:

It's a thin line between your upper lashes. Creates an illusion of fuller lashes, "opens" your eyes.

Each procedure takes from one to 3 hours, requires at least one touch up. The color of toe pigment used is custom and selected by a technician to compliment an individual's complexion without looking "overdone" or fake. Permeant makeup appears 50% to 30% brighter right after the procedure, it takes about 4 weeks for the tattooed area to heal.

WHAT CAN PREVENT YOU FROM GETTING THE PERMANENT MAKEUP DONE:

- Pregnancy
- Breastfeeding (treatment is possible, I recommend that you do your own research before you come in)
- Birthmarks or moles are avoided during the procedure
- Serious diseases such as cancer, epilepsy, autoimmune disorders (doctor's consultation is recommended)
- You're taking blood thinning medication (please, consult your doctor)
- Currently on Accutane or other strong retinoids (must wait until six months after treatment ends)
- Trearment is not possible on irritated or sunburned skin
- You've recently had Botox or Disport treatment (must wait two weeks)
- You have a broken capillary in the eyebrows area
- After waxing (must wait three days)
- After chemical peels (must wait two weeks)



- *Avoid alcohol and caffeine for at least 24 hours before the procedure
- *Do not tan for three days before the procedure
- *Do not get chemical peels two weeks prior to the procedure
- *Do not take Aspirin, Niacin, Vitamin E or Ibuprofen for 24 hours before the procedure
- *The skin in the desired permanent makeup area should not be damaged, or irritated.

AFTER THE PROCEDURE:

Some swelling and redness is normal for 48 hours or less after the procedure

- 1. Keep your eyes clean and dry, change your pillowcase. Do not touch or rub your eyes for 7 days
- 2. Rinse you eyes with a small amount of warm water and Cetaphil when you wake up and before sleep. Wash your hands prior
- 3. Apply a small amount of ointment using a swab twice daily. after you rinse your eyes
- 4. Avoid makeup for a week
- 5. Avoid excessive sweating, working out for 7 days Your healing results depend on you following the aftercare instructions
